HLT40221 Certificate IV in Aboriginal &/or Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care Practice

Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people working to provide a range of clinical primary health care services to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander clients and communities, including specific health care programs, advice and assistance with, and administration of, medication.

These workers can be expected to flexibly assume a variety of job roles and undertake a broad range of tasks either individually or as a member of a multidisciplinary team.

This qualification addresses the specific legislative responsibilities of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioners and is required for national registration with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia.

Enrolment Requirements

To be eligible for enrolment you must:

1. Be 18 years of age and provide Photo ID with proof of age.
2. Be of Aboriginal or/Torres Strait Islander Descent.
3. Be residing in Western Australia.

This course is subsidised by the Department of Training and Workforce Development for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander equity groups and jobseekers.

Registration Information

Upon successful completion of this qualification, students may be eligible for registration with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia. This registration will incur registration fee and this fee may be subject to change year to year.

When applying for registration with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia, you will be required to provide proof of Aboriginality.

Delivery mode and duration

The full qualification will be delivered over 2 years, consisting of 8 blocks face to face at 295 Manning Road, Waterford WA 6152, Marr Mooditj Training. Monday to Friday, 9am – 4pm. Refer to course schedule.

Work Placement

Students will be required to attend 480 hours of work placement and 110 hours of MMT simulated primary health care clinic during their training.

Course Fees and Charges

To be eligible for concession rates, YOU MUST provide evidence of a valid Pensioner Concession



Card or Health Care Card or Centrelink Income Statement.

For Country Students: To access travel and accommodation you must be an ABSTUDY approved student. You must provide the ABSTUDY statement to Marr Mooditj Training before any travel and accommodation can be arranged.

Screening Requirements

Students are required to obtain a Working with Children Check card and current Police Clearance to meet the work placement requirements. These screening documents must be completed within the first two weeks of commencing the course.

Please note that you will be required to meet the fees for these checks, and that Marr Mooditj Training authorised staff will be required to sign the documents so that you may apply for the lower rate as a student.
